MAJOR COURSES *You must see a Faculty Advisor in the MDL dept*

This Modern Languages major option requires a minimum of 60 hours in a combination of two modern languages: French-German, German-Spanish, Spanish-French. Students pursuing this option for the degree of Modern Languages do not need a minor.

For the language emphasized, either French, German or Spanish, students must complete a minimum of 42 hours of course work at the 2000-level or above. No more than 12 hours may be taken at the 2000 level.

To complete the 60-hour requirement, students must take at least 18 hours at the 2000-level or above in a second language. Students work with an advisor in the MDL department and are advised into intermediate and advanced classes in each language on the basis of individual background and need.
