ADN Coursework

Required by most ADN programs and transferred to MSU Denver
We DO NOT advise on ADN requirements or admission procedures

- BIO 111 – General Bio 1 (Optional for some programs)
- PSY 101 – Intro to Psychology (Optional for some programs)
- ENG 121 – English Composition 1
- PSY 235 – Human Growth and Development
- HWE 100 - Nutrition
- MAT 103 – Math for Clinical Calculations (does not transfer to MSU Denver)

MSU Denver BRNCO (RN-BSN) Prerequisites

Must be complete before taking any BSN courses
May be completed at the Community College or MSU Denver

- ENG 122 – English Composition II
- MAT 135 – Intro to Statistics
- Oral Communication – COM 115 (Public Speaking) or 125 (Interpersonal Communication)

Total transferrable credits: 9

MSU Denver General Studies

Must complete to earn BSN

Contact Department of Nursing for assistance choosing coursework

Students who have more than 6 credits of general studies coursework remaining may only take BSN coursework on a part-time sequence

May be completed at the Community College or MSU Denver (discuss best option with MSU Denver advisor)

- 6 credits Arts/Humanities
- 3 credits History
- 3 credits Social and Behavioral Sciences I
- Global Diversity Course –Best option is to overlap with another requirement (i.e. Global Diversity History Course) to reduce overall credits.

Total credits: 12

Additional Requirements

All students must have **120 credits** in order to earn a degree

All students must have **40 upper division credits** to earn a degree

- Multicultural Course – Best option is to overlap with another requirement, including Healthcare Elective, to reduce overall courses/credit
- 4 Upper Division Elective Credits – Taken at MSU Denver. May not be needed for all students. Contact your MSU Denver advisor for info.
